Mr. Brandgard: Welcome to the Plainfield Town Council meeting for January 10, 2022.

ROLL CALL TO DETERMINE QUORUM

Mr. Brandgard: Let the record show all members are present except for Mr. Kirchoff. We have a quorum for conducting business. First order, we need to elect a President and Vice President for the Council, for the next year.

(Brief pause)

(Mr. Kirchoff joins remotely)

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Brandgard: Let's do Pledge of Allegiance. I apologize, it wasn't on the agenda.

2022 TOWN COUNCIL REORGANIZATION

Mr. Brandgard: Again, we need to have our annual reorganization, so I'll open it up for nominations for President.

Mr. Angle: Well, I'll make a motion to nominate Robin Brandgard for President.

Mr. McPhail: Second

Mr. Brandgard: Thank you

Mr. Angle: Thank you. Do you accept?

Mr. Brandgard: I will accept the nomination.

Mr. Angle: Good

Mr. McPhail: I would nominate Bill Kirchoff as Vice President.

Mr. Bridget: Second

Mr. Brandgard: And I'm sure Bill will accept. With that, I will accept a motion to accept the two nominations.

Mr. McPhail: So moved.

Mr. Angle: Second

Mr. Brandgard: All those in favor signify by aye.

(All ayes)

Mr. Brandgard: Opposed? Motion carried, thank you.

EMPLOYEE RECOGNITION

Mr. Brandgard: We do have an employee recognition tonight, if Chief McKee would come forward and present it. It's certainly nice to see everyone in the audience.

Mr. McKee: Can I get Officer Sumner to come forward? You probably saw on social media that on December 28th, Plainfield Officers responded to a vehicle in a retention pond and Officer Sumner is here to be recognized for those actions. Plainfield Police Department Medal of Valor 2nd award and lifesaving medal 3rd award. On behalf of the Town of Plainfield Police Department, I hereby commend Officer Robert Sumner for his actions on December 28, 2021. Officer Sumner responded to a report of a quickly sinking vehicle in a retention pond at the intersection of Stafford Road and Perry Road, in front of the Amazon warehouse. Once on the scene, Officer Sumner immediately advised that he was removing his equipment and entering the pond without a radio. Officer Sumner swam to the middle of the retention pond and break the rear window of the vehicle that was sinking. After breaking the window, he was able to use the knife to cut the deployed airbag away from the vehicle and observed the female driver that was still on the phone with 911 and barely above the rising water level within the vehicle. Officer Sumner pulled the female driver from the vehicle and swam her to shore. The quick and decisive actions of Officer Robert Sumner in this incident were taken at his own personal peril and ultimately prevented death to a female driver in the completely submerged vehicle. Officer Robert Sumner's selfless actions in the face of danger should be commended as exemplary law enforcement service. Congratulations.

Mr. Sumner: I don't really know what to say, other than I was hoping tonight that the two citizens that were there that day had been able to be here. We all know we would have done it, any one of us would have. (inaudible) it was great to see citizens jump in and (inaudible). Thank you

Mr. Brandgard: Before everybody leaves, I would like to say a few words. It is good to see that we have a police department that reacts quickly in a situation and takes care of it, even though it might put yourself in some kind of harm. So, I want to thank everybody.

Mr. Bridget: Mr. President, I'd also like to comment on the team support that I see at the back of the room. Thank you very much.

Mr. Brandgard: I'd also like to recognize the fact that we have two Police Commissioners on the audience tonight, it's good to see them. Chief, I want to thank you for doing that in this meeting. You normally present those at the Police Commissioner's meeting, but this is one where we need to have some good recognition and this was the place to do it, and I want to thank you for doing it.

Mr. McKee: And I'll just add, that was the second highest award we can possibly get. You usually don't want the Medal of Honor, or it's not one that you really strive to get because usually bad things happen afterwards. But that was the second time that officer has received the second highest award, and the third time that he's received the Lifesaving Medal, which you only get if you actually save a life. In my day, when I first started, that was something that rarely happened and we're seeing it happen more and more, so like you all said, they're doing great work.

Mr. Brandgard: We also have a public hearing tonight. (inaudible) Do we have proof of publication?

Mr. Daniel: Yes, we do.

Mr. Brandgard: Very good, thank you. The public hearing is for the Annexation of 515 Avon Avenue. Is there anybody who wishes to address us relative to the annexation?

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: Again, this is a public hearing for the Annexation of 515 Avon Avenue. This is the opportunity for the public to comment.

Mr. Brandgard: With nobody coming forward, the public hearing is closed.

BID OPENING

Mr. Brandgard: We have a bid opening.

Mr. Bangel: Before we get into the bid opening process for the Splash Island Maintenance Project, I did talk with town management as well as a couple of the council members prior to tonight, fully anticipating that we didn't have a whole lot of interest in this project. We've actually already delayed the bid process one council meeting, and we have reposted the scope of work needed a different way to try and attract more interest. We're fully anticipating only having one bid tonight, which I believe that is all we received at this time. I would ask council to give consent to read this bid, and for us to review that, based on the urgency of getting the work completed to Splash Island before it opens this season.

Mr. Brandgard: Okay, thank you.

Mr. Angle: Well, I would go ahead and make a motion, unless there's questions, that we move forward in opening the one bid that we received tonight.

Mr. Angle: And then we can review it, you know, and take it from there.

Mr. Brandgard: Motion and a second. All those in favor signify by aye.

Mr. Brandgard: Opposed? Motion carried, thank you.

Mr. Daniel: The one bid that I received is from American Clean & Seal. Don't have Mark here tonight to be the envelope opener.

Mr. Brandgard: Well, I'd throw this to you, but it's kind of dangerous.

Mr. McPhail: I don't have any tools.

Mr. Brandgard: Well, I made sure there was some up here.

(Mr. Daniel reviews the bid)

Mr. Daniel: American Clean & Seal bid is in proper form. The bid amount on American Clean & Seal is \$165,955. That's \$165,955.

Mr. Brandgard: Thank you. The engineer's estimate was \$174,000. Again, the engineer's estimate was \$174,000. Brent, who would you like to have on your review committee?

Mr. Bangel: I'd ask Lance if he's able to be on the bid review committee, as well as Mike McCrary with Banning Engineering.

Mr. Brandgard: Who?

Mr. Bangel: Mike McCrary with Banning Engineering, and myself.

Mr. Brandgard: Very good.

Mr. Bangel: Okay, thank you.

Mr. Brandgard: If you would, review and come back at the next meeting with a recommendation.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Mr. Brandgard: With that, we'll go to Town Manager's report.

Mr. Klinger: Alright, and I will note that we did ask the department heads that if they didn't have a report or any items on the agenda, that they go ahead stay home and watch the meeting remotely so that we don't have a crowded room. I do have a couple of things to report. First, I do have a certification from the Plan Commission.

In my capacity as Secretary of the Town of Plainfield Plan Commission, I hereby certify that the Plan Commission held a public hearing on Monday, January 3, 2022, on petition RZ-21-139 as filed by Isaac Awale, requesting a Zone Map Amendment of 5 acres of land from GC: General Commercial and I-2: Office/Warehouse Distribution to R-1: Low Density Residential. Upon concluding the public hearing, the Plan Commission voted 6 in favor, 0 in opposition to forward a favorable recommendation to the Town of Plainfield Town Council to amend the Zone Map for this property.

I would appreciate your acceptance of this certification.

Mr. Brandgard: I just want to say, I thought there were some qualifications on that; they had some things they had come back...

Mr. Klinger: There were some qualifications attached, some conditions placed on that, that actually relate back to another portion of the same property, that he had not met some previous conditions. So, yes, that is part of this.

Mr. Brandgard: Part of this? Okay.

Mr. Angle: Well, with that being said, I move to accept the recommendation of Plan Commission.

Mr. Bridget: Second

Mr. Brandgard: We have a motion and a second to accept the recommendation from the Plainfield Plan Commission relative to RZ-21-139, as filed by Isaac Awale, requesting a Zone Map Amendment to 5 acres of land from GC: General Commercial and I-2: Office/ Warehouse Distribution to R-1: Low Density Residential, with conditions that were placed upon that by the Plan Commission.

Mr. Klinger: Just to clarify that, there's a certain timeframe in which I have to certify the recommendation of the Plan Commission; the actual ordinance that actually makes the Zone Map Change is conditioned upon Mr. Awale meeting those conditions. So, you'll see that there is no ordinance on this matter on the agenda tonight, because he has not, at this point, met those conditions. So, that will come later.

Mr. Brandgard: Okay. So, all those in favor signify by aye.

(All ayes)

Mr. Brandgard: Opposed? Motion carried.

Mr. Klinger: And then the only other item I have was wanting to reference the memo that I sent out to you all regarding some organizational chart changes, and really two key items of that, which is creating two positions. One, we've had some conversation about, since last fall, the idea of creating a Director for Public Safety. And then a second one that I introduced to you through the memo, which is the creation of a new Assistant Town Manager role. I provided that organizational chart as well as the job descriptions to you over the weekend, and I would appreciate your consideration of those roles at this time, so we can move forward with that. I think, as I expresses the immediate need for really that Assistant Town Manager role, we have an opportunity there to pursue a particular candidate. The other position, in terms of Public Safety, is something that we can roll out later in the year. It's not as urgent but it's something we still want to pursue. The only other thing I will say is the organizational chart I sent you, it also has the Director of Communications reporting through Nate as Assistant Town Manager, and I think that's still something that's being discussed, so I'm not really asking for that piece of it. I think there can be more conversation about that and how that is set up.

Mr. Bridget: Well, I would move that we create a position of Director of Public Safety and a second Town Manager position.

Mr. Klinger: Assistant Town Manager

Mr. Bridget: Sorry, sorry.

Mr. Klinger: I don't want a second Town Manager.

Mr. Bridget: Let me rephrase that, Assistant Town Manager, a second Assistant Town Manager.

Mr. McPhail: It was muffled enough with that mask that I'm glad that you clarified it. I'll second the motion.

Mr. Brandgard: We have a motion and a second to create a new position of Director of Public Safety and also a second Assistant Town Manager. If there's no further discussion...

Mr. Kirchoff: Robin?

Mr. Brandgard: Yes?

Mr. Kirchoff: I couldn't get Lifesize to work earlier, so the only question I have – which I support what Andrew's recommending but I do have some comments or thoughts around both Communication and the Budget Director, but overall, I support it. Did you have any conversations about funding?

Mr. Klinger: So, I did mention – sorry, hold on – I did mention in my memo in terms of the Assistant Town Manager – both of these positions really, we can divide that expense across multiple funds, which helps so that it only has a marginal hit on certain funds. The Assistant Town Manager, I think we – and I don't know that we have a concrete plan just yet, but we're working with Steve on this, but it would probably be funded out of Utilities, General Fund, possibly some MVH and Parks. I think it's just coming down to which budgets – some of it will come down to the roll itself, but also which budgets can sustain how much of that. So, I don't know that we have

a concrete plan but that's – you know, we're trying to kind of approach it from hitting it on multiple funds so that it's only a marginal increase in each, if that makes sense.

Mr. Kirchoff: Okay, thank you.

Mr. Klinger: And the same would be true of the Public Safety position, it would just be different funds that we're talking about.

Mr. Brandgard: With that, I would ask for a roll call vote.

Mr. Todisco:
