Mr. Brandgard: The Plainfield Town Council meeting for Monday, October 25, 2021 is now in session.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mr. Brandgard: I'd like to ask everyone to rise for the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL TO DETERMINE QUORUM

Mr. Brandgard: Let the record show all members are in attendance and we have a quorum for conducting business.

CONSENT AGENDA

Mr. Brandgard: We have several items on the consent agenda this evening.

1. Approval of the Minutes of the Town Council meeting of October 11, 2021.
2. Approval of the Accounts Payable Docket of Expenditures and Affidavits of Payroll, per the Clerk-Treasurer's Report.
3. Approval of the Human Resources Report dated October 8, 2021.

Are there any additions or corrections to the consent agenda?

Mr. Angle: Mr. president, not any additions but I do have a quick question. On the consent agenda, #2 the Clerks-Treasurer report, accounts payable, came across late this afternoon; I just had a chance to look at it right before the meeting, and I noticed on page 2, the first line item is crossed out. The "unpaid" was crossed out and it was put "paid" and then it says "correction made on batch 7297" – I couldn't track where that had been updated, and so I wasn't sure if the total was correct or if the invoice was correct. And then also further down, another batch, 7301, there was a whole section of Duke Energy invoices that was just crossed out with pen as well. So, I just thought I'd bring that up. I don't know if you want to speak to that now or look into it and get back to me but...

Mr. Todisco: I'll have to look into it; she sent that out late this afternoon.

Mr. Angle: Yeah – so, I'm not sure I can move forward with the AP Docket without those being answered.

Mr. Brandgard: You want to pull that off?

Mr. Angle: Okay, great. Thank you.

Mr. Brandgard: We'll pull item #2 off until the next meeting when we have another chance to get it reviewed.

Mr. Kirchoff: Can we leave payroll on?

Mr. Angle: Yeah, payroll will be fine.

Mr. Brandgard: Okay, we'll leave payroll on. Item #2, we'll remove the docket of expenditures and leave the affidavits of payroll for approval.

Mr. Todisco: Now let me ask you this – now, you've got a few concerns on a few times; if we pull it off, that means that we aren't approved to pay any of those bills, right? Do you want...?

Mr. Angle: I didn't know that. Is that correct?

Mr. Brandgard: Yes

Mr. Angle: Okay

Mr. Klinger: Yeah

Mr. Angle: Because, I mean, the first page on the report – is there a policy that states that? Because the report says, “we’ve examined”, and then it asks for my signature.

Mr. Kirchoff: They’re not authorized to run any checks until we approve them.

Mr. Brandgard: That’s what this is, it’s approval to pay the bills.

Mr. Angle: Gotcha, I’m just stating that the first page doesn’t say that things won't be paid unless it’s approved. But I get it; if there's a policy in place, there's a policy in place. So, I don’t know if you just want to look into it while we are here in the meeting, and maybe by the end of the meeting you can speak to it, so that it doesn’t delay it.

Mr. Klinger: So, the first item was relating to Duke Energy, it looks like, right?

Mr. Todisco: Yes

(inaudible)

Mr. Klinger: So, the Clerk-Treasurer’s Office does have authority – and Mel can correct me if I’m wrong – but to pay utility bills, I believe.

Mr. Daniel: Without approval...?

Mr. Klinger: Yeah, without approval from the Council, I think that he has that authority.

Mr. Todisco: We have, but I just wanted to make sure.

Mr. Klinger: Maybe we just exclude those specific items that you noted, and then they can look into it and make whatever corrections need to be made, and still be able to make those payments, as I understand it.

Mr. Angle: Would it be acceptable to maybe approve, and then pending those two batch number questions and then come back?

Mr. Todisco: Yeah, that’s what I was asking, if we could do it that way, in that sense, but... Yeah, I’ll have to – we have a new person and I’ll remind her to contact me on something like this from now on.

Mr. Angle: Okay

Mr. Todisco: Because she just sent that out late and I didn’t catch it.

Mr. Daniel: You can do that.

Mr. Angle: So, Mr. President, I’d just like to make the recommendation to move forward with the approval of consent agenda item #2, pending the answers on batch #7297 and batch #7301 – for them being scratched out and written by hand.

Mr. Kirchoff: And that he includes it in his next Clerk-Treasurer’s report.

Mr. Angle: Okay

Mr. Kirchoff: So that we have closure.

Mr. Brandgard: Yeah

Mr. Klinger: Yeah, that sounds...

Mr. Angle: So then follow up in your next report.

Mr. Todisco: Okay, I’ll follow up with it, yeah.

Mr. Kirchoff: Okay

Mr. Brandgard: Okay, Alternate #3, again for Year 1, \$54.00.

Mr. Castetter: (inaudible) where it says, "Alternate #1," it should be "Alternate #2". When it's "Alternate #2", it should be "Alternate #3".

Mr. Brandgard: That helps clear up my confusion somewhat.

Mr. Castetter: Yeah, that's – my apologies.

Mr. Daniel: Jason, why don't you start again on that?

Mr. Castetter: Okay

Mr. Brandgard: Base Bid Year 1 is \$190.44, Alternate #2 Year 1 is \$120.00, Alternate #3 for Year 1 is \$54.00.

Mr. Kirchoff: And are those per household? Per household on all of them?

Mr. Brandgard: Per household.

(inaudible)

Mr. Brandgard: Okay, Alternate Bid #4 is \$20 per tote, Alternate #5 for leaf collection is \$75,000.00. Again, Ray's Trash Service, their Base Bid Year 1 is \$190.44, Alternate #2 for Year 1 is \$120.00, Alternate #3 for Year 1 is \$54.00, Alternate #4 for branding is \$20.00, and Alternate #5 for leaf collection is \$75,000.00

(Inaudible conversation)

Mr. Daniel: The second bid is from Republic Services.

(Mr. Daniel reviews the bid)

Mr. Daniel: I will let you read for the public, the letter attached to their bid.

Mr. Brandgard: The letter is from Republic Services to the town. "Re: Request for bids: Residential Trash and recycling collection services in the Town of Plainfield Indiana. Dear Town Council of Plainfield, on behalf of Republic Services we would like to thank you for the opportunity to submit a bid for the Residential Trash and Recycling Collection Services in the Town of Plainfield. After a careful review of the Town of Plainfield and the town specifications, Republic Services has decided to submit a "no bid" at this time. Republic is continually reviewing our operation and subsequent capabilities for future opportunities to serve the Town of Plainfield. We would request to remain on the bidder's list of qualified waste and recycling companies for the Town of Plainfield for any future opportunities. Again, thank you for the opportunity and consideration. Should the town require additional information or clarification on our submission, please feel free to contact me. Respectfully, Craig Lutz, Manager of Municipal Sales, Republic Services." – thank you.

Mr. Klinger: That's a new one for me.

Mr. Daniel: Me too.

Mr. Brandgard: That's a new one. So, obviously we have a bid that we have opened and read to the public – I'll ask the Council, are we willing to accept one bid?

Mr. Kirchoff: We need (inaudible) the committee to review it.

Mr. Angle: So, it would be my recommendation that we do just move this one bid to the committee for review. At that point the committee will have the opportunity to accept or make a recommendation to the Council.

Mr. Kirchoff: And which alternatives we might want to consider.

Mr. Brandgard: Yeah, well I was just asking, as general, if we hadn't opened it, and only had one bid, we would have asked the question, do we open it or not.

Mr. McPhail: Yeah

Mr. Brandgard: That's why I was asking the question...

Mr. Kirchoff: Well, we already have, so...

Mr. Daniel: Yeah, we didn't get a choice tonight, so...

Mr. Brandgard: So, with that I would ask a bid review committee of Dan Bridget, Lance Angle, Andrew Klinger, Jason Castetter, and Steve Dyson, to review the bid and get back at the next meeting with a recommendation. Thank you.

Mr. Klinger: We'll do that, thank you.

Mr. Brandgard: Thank you everybody who submitted a bid. As you said, it's a little different.

Mr. Daniel: Yes

Mr. McPhail: My first experience – you have what you thought was a bid and then you open it, and it wasn't.

Mr. Brandgard: With that, thank you.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Mr. Brandgard: We have several public hearings this evening. Do we have proof of publication?

Mr. Daniel: Yes, we do.

Mr. Brandgard: Thank you. The first public hearing is for Tax Abatement of Walgreens Distribution Center. Again, this is a public hearing; if there's anyone who wishes to address us relative to the Walgreens Distribution Center, now is the time to come forward and address us.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: Again, this is a public hearing for Walgreens Distribution Center Tax Abatement.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: With nobody coming forward, that public hearing is closed. We do have a public hearing for Additional Appropriation – General Obligation Bonds (Road & Infrastructure Improvements). Again, this is a public hearing; now is the time for anybody who wishes to address us relative to General Obligation Bonds (Road & Infrastructure Improvements) – Additional Appropriation, now is the time.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: With nobody coming forward, we'll close that public hearing. The next public hearing is Additional Appropriation – (Multiple Funds).

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: Again, this is a public hearing; if there's anybody in the audience who wishes to address us relative to Additional Appropriation – (Multiple Funds), now is the time to come forward.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: With nobody coming forward, we'll close that public hearing. We also have a public hearing for Annexation - Lot 26 and 27 Medallion Meadows.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: This is a public hearing relative to the annexation of the Annexation of Lot 26 and 27 Medallion Meadows. If anyone wishes to address us, now is the time to come forward.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: With nobody coming forward, we'll close that public hearing. We also have a public hearing for the Annexation - Friendswood East Phase 2. Again, this is a public hearing for the Annexation of Friendswood East Phase 2. If anybody is in the audience who wishes to address us, now is the time to come forward.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: With nobody coming forward, we'll close that public hearing. The next public hearing is for the Annexation - Lambert Avalon North, Phase 2, NW Corner Gibbs Road and Vestal Road.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: Again, this is a public hearing for the Annexation of Lambert Avalon North, Phase 2, NW Corner Gibbs Road and Vestal Road. If anybody is in the audience who wishes to address us, now is the time to come forward.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: With nobody coming forward, we'll close that public hearing. The next public hearing is for the Annexation - Vanbibber Property – 5311 Gibbs Road.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: Again, this is a public hearing for the Annexation of the Vanbibber Property – 5311 Gibbs Road. If anybody is in the audience who wishes to address us on this matter, now is the time to come forward.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: With nobody coming forward, that public hearing is closed. We also have a public hearing for the Annexation - Lot 9, Willman's Lake, 2nd Section.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: Again, this is a public hearing for the Annexation of Lot 9, Willman's Lake, 2nd Section. If anybody is in the audience who wishes to address us, now is the time to come forward.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: With nobody coming forward, we'll close that annexation. We also have an Annexation - Lot 17, Charter Oaks.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: If anybody is in the audience who wishes to address us relative to Annexation of Lot 17, Charter Oaks., now is the time to come forward.

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: With nobody coming forward, we'll close that annexation. Thank you.

BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

Mr. Brandgard: Now I'll go to business from the floor, and I know the Lions Cub has something.

Mr. Iles: Mr. President, my name is Tom Iles, and I am the Club President of the Plainfield Lion's Club. Tonight, we are here to make a special presentation to you.

Mr. Brandgard: To me?

Mr. Iles: To you

Mr. Brandgard: Okay

Mr. Iles: I don't know how many of you know this, but Robin has been a Lion since March 1st of 1971, which means that he celebrated his 50th anniversary of being a Lion this year. Mr. Iles: More things that you get – here's the letter, and you also get a fellowship pin, and a patch for the W.P. Woods Fellowship.

Mr. Brandgard: Thank you so very much. I'm deeply touched and honored. The story is, I went to all the meetings until I decided to run for Council, and then we ran into a conflict with Mondays. Occasionally I get back, but not as often as I would like. Thank you very much.

Mr. Brandgard: Thank you; very nice surprise. Thank you. Is there any other business from the floor this evening?

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: Again, any other business from the floor?

(Brief pause)

Mr. Brandgard: There being none, we'll go to staff reports.

STAFF REPORTS

Mr. Brandgard: Tim, anything from Development Services? Anything from Public Works? Scott, transportation?

Mr. Singleton: Yes, thank you, I do have just one item, I would like to follow up on our work session discussion, and go ahead and request the Council's consent to issue the request for proposals concerning the 2021 scoping alignment study. We are going to be seeking submissions of proposals from three consultants for various roadway improvements associated with the road relinquishment from INDOT.

Mr. Brandgard: Consent?

(Consent is given)

Mr. Singleton: Great, thank you.

Mr. Brandgard: Thank you. Anything from the Police Department? Steve, anything from the financial world? Okay, I want to make sure I didn't miss any staff. Nate, anything from your part of the world – which is about everything? Nothing additional – Mel?

Mr. Daniel: Nothing additional, thank you.

Mr. Brandgard: Mark?

Mr. Todisco: Mr. President, I just wanted to – looking at that report, the question that you asked – I just wanted to make sure, because you mentioned Duke in the conversation – we do pay them automatically by wire, ACH basically, and it seems – I'll look into it further but it seems like she might have had some mistakes there where she just crossed them out. I looked further and Duke was paid. So, I just wanted to make sure, in case someone's listening, that we did pay Duke Energy.

Mr. Brandgard: Okay. Good, thank you.

TOWN MANAGER'S REPORT

Mr. Brandgard: Do we have a Town Manager's report?

Mr. Klinger: Just a couple of items. Really, I just wanted to point out – the whole long list of annexations that we had public hearings on – obviously we had a little bit of pent-up matters there, from the last year. Four of those six are all properties owned by the town that have been acquired, most of them down south of I-70 in the area of Sodalis Park. We have been wanting to annex those in for some time but because of COVID some of those cases got put off. And so, now we're trying to get them going here, and that's why the long agenda; I apologize.

Mr. Brandgard: Well, the census kind of help up annexations also.

Mr. Klinger: Right, we weren't allowed to annex – exactly. So, there was a little bit of pent-up demand, but we're working through that. I also just wanted to note that there are three ordinances at the end of the agenda that were zoning changes related to the Trescott. If you recall, they requested a continuance while the MOU was being negotiated. Now that that's been addressed through the consent agenda, we would ask that you remove those ordinances from the table and consider those this evening. So, I just wanted to point that out on the agenda. And then I also just wanted to note, of course we have our retreat scheduled for this Friday, so I'll

have Melanie send out an email later in the week with information about location – which, I believe it's here – and we'll get all of that information out to you. That's all I have, thank you.

Mr. Kirchoff: Any prep for Friday?

Mr. Klinger: I'm sorry?

Mr. Kirchoff: Any prep for Friday?

Mr. Klinger: Um, I don't think so...

Mr. Angle: We'll get the agenda a day or two in advance?

Mr. Klinger: Yeah, we're putting the final – I mean, we pretty have an agenda; we can get that out to you.

Mr. Angle: Okay

Mr. Klinger: We're still putting the finishing touches on some presentation items, but I don't think there's necessarily any prep items for you, other than we'll get that agenda out.

(inaudible)

Mr. Klinger: Open mind – there you go, yeah.

Mr. Kirchoff: He didn't say open pocketbook, did he.

Mr. Klinger: That's all I have – oh, Robin, I don't know if you wanted to see the video that Brad brought in – if you want to ask him to come up.

Mr. Brandgard: I was about to do that. Brad, do you have something to bring to us tonight? Andrew let the cat out of the bag already, but that's okay.

Mr. DuBois: Thanks Andrew, no, we've had this for a little while, but I wanted you all to see it. It's a promotional video that Vince Duke did for us – he's right here in Plainfield. He does excellent work; he was there all day with the parade. You may have seen it; some may have not, but I thought it'd be valid to show it to you for next year.

Mr. Kirchoff: Sound?

Mr. DuBois: That's the best part. Anyway, while he's working on that I did want to thank everybody for all the help the town provided; the Police Department, the Fire Department, DPW. I think it was one of the best parades we've had. It certainly rivals the last two.

(Video plays)

Mr. Kirchoff: Oh yeah, well done.

(Applause)

Mr. DuBois: Yeah, Vince did an awesome job on that. There's something magical about when you go down that hill – and I'm usually in front of the parade – and you go down that first of Hobbs hill and you see all those people lined up down there; it's just absolutely amazing. And then I sit at the top of Vestal and watch everybody come up, and it's one of the best parts of my job. I just want to thank you guys for allowing us to show that video.

Mr. Angle: Thank you for sharing that.

Mr. DuBois: Sure, thank you.

Mr. Brandgard: Brad, I want to thank you. That was the first parade I'd missed in years; I had to go out of town on business and I was gone, and you know, later in the afternoon I called Brad and said, "How did the parade go?" and he says, "Great" and I felt good about that. Thank you for sharing.

Mr. DuBois: We didn't have any issues that I'm aware of, so it was good.

Mr. Brandgard: Thank you

Mr. Bridget: I think they call that a Chamber of Commerce Day.

Mr. DuBois: I'd definitely a Chamber of Commerce Day, that's for sure. Thank you
