## PLAINFIELD'S ADA TRANSITION PLAN UPDATE

In 1990, the Federal Government passed the American with Disabilities Act (ADA). This legislation led to sweeping changes across the country, including a renewed vision to ensure public facilities are accessible for all citizens.

In 2013, the Town adopted its first ADA Transition Plan for our Pedestrian Network. A Transition Plan recognizes that many public facilities, particularly infrastructure, have been built that are not fully accessible by today's standards. Evolving standards, new technologies, and even simple aging and wear can affect accessibility compliance. Thus, the reality is that a community is always transitioning to be more accessible. With this in mind, the Town has been preparing the Plainfield ADA Transition Plan Update for 2021. A draft version of this plan was recently presented to the Town Council and now we'd like to invite feedback from the public as we prepare to finalize the plan and request adoption by the Council. We invite you to check out the draft plan and provide any feedback you feel would improve on our approach to make Plainfield's pedestrian network more accessible.

# PLAINFIELD NEWCOMER'S MEETING

Are you new to Plainfield? Would you like to be more engaged and informed about what's going on in Plainfield? Then, the Plainfield Newcomer's Meeting is for you!

The "Welcome to Plainfield" Newcomers Club meetings are designed to provide newcomers (or folks who want to become more connected to the Town of Plainfield) an opportunity to interact with Town, Library and other government officials, ask questions, learn what's going on in the community, and become oriented to life in Plainfield.
